a. Election of Officers, Advisory Committee Members

With the Board of County Commissioners reappointing Open Space Advisory Committee members, it is time for the annual Election of Officers.

b. Tincup Ridge Park – Internal Land Exchange JCOS20-18, Resolution #20-18

The proposed Tincup Ridge Park is the gateway to the central foothills of Jefferson County and the first mountain ridge that visitors see as they head west from the Denver-Metro area. Located west of Rooney Road, north of I-70, and east of U.S. Highway 40, the property includes a string of undesignated trails that traverse the ridge, several artificial turf fields that are leased to the City of Golden and used by area soccer clubs, and the Rooney Road Recycling Center. Through an internal transfer of parcels between JCOS and the General Fund, JCOS has an opportunity to reconfigure Tincup Ridge Park to include long-desired improvements to the Parks' natural surface trails and provide a regional trail connection between Apex Park and Matthews/Winters Park. Additionally, the Rooney Road Recycling Center can expand operations on the General Fund property to include a site for Jeffco residents to drop household trees and shrubs for composting, and the City of Golden can invest funds to make much needed improvements to the aging turf fields through an extension of its lease with Jefferson County.
