

OPEN BURNING PERMIT APPLICATION

Modified on 07/2022

ATTENTION: Jefferson County Public Health (JCPH) ONLY issues open burning permits for wildfire prevention through fuel reduction activities, which are forest management/broadcast burns for wildfire mitigation occurring at locations at 6,400 feet or above. Please regard the following:

- Forest management burns consist of tree slash piles of woody material, no larger than 8'x8'x8' with all tree limbs/branches six inches or less in diameter. These burns are generally associated with insect/disease control and wildfire prevention. No more than 50 piles may be burned for the life of the permit.
- Broadcast burns are the controlled application of fire to wildland fuels over a predetermined area comprising no more than 10 acres of grass or 5 acres of other vegetation. These burns do NOT include wildland fuels that have been concentrated in piles by manual or mechanical methods.

All permits are approved based on the materials to be burned, the potential contribution to air pollution, the potential impact from smoke on the health and welfare of the public, and if a practical alternative for the disposal of the material is available. Burns greater than the allowed limits are required to obtain a state prescribed fire permit via the Colorado Department of Public Health & Environment (CDPHE).

- Any business or resident wishing to conduct an open burn must comply with state open burn regulations, in addition to any local ordinances or regulations.
- Burning of tree stumps, trash, garbage, construction debris, hazardous materials, leaves or lawn clippings, food waste, and other man-made materials is **NOT** permitted in Jefferson County at any time.
- All slash burns **MUST** be performed in open piles. Burning in barrels or incinerators is **NOT** allowed.

A declaration is required for applicants who are unable to use alternative disposal methods (See Page 2).

***** Any person who violates the Colorado Air Pollution Prevention and Control Act, its implementing regulations or any permit issued thereunder may be issued an order for compliance that can include permit revocation and assessment of penalties of up to \$15,000 per day of such violation in accordance with § 25-7-122, C.R.S.*****

Please note: In coordination with the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office, JCPH will not issue any open burn permits during a Fire Restriction (Stage 1) or a Fire Ban (Stage 2), as open burning is not permissible during Jefferson County fire restrictions or bans (IFC 105.6.30). 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APPLICATION CHECKLIST:

- Slash pile(s) are situated on bare ground or sparse grass, at a safe distance from any trees, structures or roads, and are not built under overhead utilities.
- All tree limbs/branches in the pile are 6" or less in diameter.
- The fuels intended to burn are clean and dry. All unapproved materials are not present.

REQUIRED ATTACHMENTS:

- Clear photo documentation of pile(s) to be burned (representative pile).
- **FEE:** \$80.00 – You can bring in or enclose a check or money order payable to “Jefferson County Treasurer.” Credit cards are accepted in person, or payment can be made over the phone by calling our Environmental Health Division at 303.232.6301. Cash is accepted in person only. This fee is NONREFUNDABLE and does not guarantee the issuance of a burning permit.
