

Aquahawk- Encourage water metering/ monitoring

Water conservation through design

- Important, but will take a lot of public education

High density in mountains?

- Send out report

Don't do a good job at educating people about water use and ways to reduce

Rate increase for increased water use

- Shaming of water use- like Excel's reports

Encourage clustering if there are benefits- if interpreted correctly- allowing more land to be undisturbed

- Identify recharge- recharge/ porous concrete. Get information about it to new owners if developers have done it

How do we motivate people to decrease water use?

- Did county facilities master plan have water efficiency goals?

- Can we encourage county to use things like public pavers?

Wildfire

- Will County be subject to new regulations?

Transportation improvements in mountains- curb and gutter along 73 seems odd

- Why was curb and gutter done rather than shoulder and ditch? Recharge is better without the curb and gutter conveying water downstream

- Could also save money

Denver Water does rebates for some things but not all landscaping renovations

- Add policy about water conservation incentive programs- maybe modify #4 to include working with water providers

- Competition between communities
