RE: Extension of Executive Order D 2020 12 – II(i) – County Treasurers

**D 2020 012 – II(i)**

**I authorize the County Treasurers of the State of Colorado to take action to suspend or waive delinquent interest that may accrue pursuant to the provisions of § 39-10-104.5 as a result of delinquent tax payments. Any action by a Treasurer concerning such action shall be made available on the Treasurer's website, electronic mail (if possible) and automated messages.**

Dear Governor Polis,

As the Jefferson County Treasurer, I respectfully request that you extend Executive Order D 2020 12 – II(i) through at least through May 31<sup>st</sup> and then possibly through June 20<sup>th</sup>, 2020.

April 30<sup>th</sup> and June 15<sup>th</sup> are two very important due dates for property tax payments. The ability of the County Treasurer to waive late interest and accept multiple payments through June 20, 2020 provides an incentive, rather than a hammer, to allow taxpayers to pay their property taxes. The goal of the Jefferson County Treasurer to collect property taxes and to make taxing entities and the County whole as soon as possible.

I do not recommend the delaying of property tax payments or changing the due dates at this time.

As the Jefferson County Treasurer, I believe the simple extension of II(i) is needed to provide some financial relief and planning to businesses and taxpayers throughout Jefferson County at very little cost or lost revenues to the County or local governments. Thank you in advance for your support of this extension.
