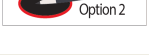

A ballot question listed as an "Amendment" proposes a change to the Colorado constitution, and a ballot question listed as a "Proposition" proposes a change to the Colorado Revised Statutes. A "YES/FOR" vote on any ballot question is a vote in favor of changing current law or existing circumstances, and a "NO/AGAINST" vote on any ballot question is a vote against changing current law or existing circumstances.
