NOTICE OF RESCISSION OF JEFFERSON COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH ORDER 21-004 REQUIRING FACE COVERINGS FOR ALL INDIVIDUALS AGES 3+ IN INDOOR SPACES IN ALL LOCAL GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS IN LIGHT OF NEW JEFFERSON COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH ORDER 21-006 REQUIRING FACE COVERINGS FOR ALL INDIVIDUALS AGES 3+ IN PUBLIC INDOOR SPACES

Along with the State of Colorado, Jefferson County Public Health (“JCPH”) is working to stop the spread of coronavirus 2019 (“COVID-19”).


On October 8, 2021, the Jefferson County Board of Health issued JCPH Order 21-004 requiring all individuals in Jefferson County, Colorado, to wear face coverings with certain limited exceptions, while inside all local government buildings to preserve hospital capacity, to protect public employees, and to protect those members of the public who must do business with or otherwise interact with local governments (“JCPHO 21-004”). JCPHO 21-004 became effective at 12:01 a.m. on October 9, 2021.

On November 22, 2021, the JCPH Board of Health issued JCPH Order 21-006 requiring face coverings for all individuals ages 3+ in public indoor spaces (“JCPHO 21-006”). At the same meeting, the Board of Health further voted to rescind JCPHO 21-004 to promote consistency in face covering requirements within Jefferson County.

Because JCPHO 21-006 applies to all public indoor spaces, including local government buildings, the Jefferson County Board of Health hereby rescinds JCPH Order 21-004 effective immediately. All individuals and businesses in Jefferson County must follow the face covering requirements set forth in JCPHO 21-006.

This Order immediately rescinds JCPH Order 21-004, which shall no longer be in effect as of this date.
