Changes to SNAP and Medicaid benefits

The Basics

What is the Public Health Emergency?

The Public Health Emergency (PHE) is the COVID-19 pandemic and government's response to it.

How does the PHE affect SNAP and Medicaid Benefits?

At the beginning of the PHE, the federal government put a number of programs in place to aid citizens through the PHE's unique difficulties. Such programs include Emergency Allotment SNAP benefits and Continuous Coverage for Health First Colorado (the state of Colorado's Medicaid program) benefits.

Emergency Allotment (SNAP)

SNAP beneficiaries saw the amount of their benefits increase when the PHE went into effect to the highest amount possible. This is called Emergency Allotment.

Continuous Coverage (Medicaid)

Congress passed legislation that ensured anyone enrolled in Medicaid (in Colorado, Health First Colorado) programs was guaranteed to keep their health coverage during the PHE. As the PHE unwinds for the Health First Colorado program, states will return to normal eligibility renewal/redetermination and enrollment processes and requirements.

When do these programs end in Colorado?

Emergency Allotment (SNAP)

• Ended February 2023

Continuous Coverage (Medicaid)

- Renewal and redetermination processes begin May 2023
- Redetermination of cases will take place over the course of a year

When are Medicaid cases redetermined?

Renewal/redetermination will occur in each case's predetermined renewal month.

How can my Medicaid case be renewed?

First, ensure your contact information is up-to-date in PEAK. Next, if you received your renewal paperwork in the mail, please sign and return it to Jefferson County Human Services by the date indicated in the letter.

Renewal of Medicaid cases is determined based on several factors, including but not limited to:

- Income
- Household size

You may also receive a call from a Jefferson County Eligibility Specialist to clarify information.
