2016

Alderfer Ranch House and Barn

Constitutes the heart of present-day Alderfer/Three Sisters Park, dating back to the 1873 James T. Hester Homestead. It has always served as something of a landmark, an awe-inspiring site of natural history.
Approved: September 12, 2016

Arvada Jaycee Hall

Dating back 115 years, was the first non-residential structure in what is now known as "Olde Town Arvada." The building holds historic, architectural, cultural, political and social significance – it is an integral part of both the City of Arvada and Jefferson County's heritage. The Jaycee Hall is listed on the Colorado Register of Historic Places.

Big Red Barn

Was constructed as part of the George Kennedy homestead in 1864 that became known as Beaver Ranch. It maintained its place as a regional gathering place, a site of political rallies and a vacation destination well into the Twentieth Century.

Approved: June 6, 2016

Center for the Arts, Evergreen

Started life in the early 1880s as the first Soda Creek Schoolhouse. The small, white-washed school was moved into the Evergreen, Bergen Park area and became home to the Bergen Park Community Church. The reuse of the old one-room schoolhouse with its more modern style building addition is a significant part of the historic character of the Bergen Park community.

2017

The Octagonal Barn

Constructed around 1927, is a significant landmark through its association with former historic landowners in the area as well as its distinctive octagonal architecture mirroring Swedish vernacular architectural forms.
